


















## March Meeting Minutes By Jan Weber Secretary

### NCV Business Meeting Minutes March 1, 2022

- CALL TO ORDER:
  - President Carm Finocchiaro called the meeting to order at 6:31 pm.
- APPROVAL OF MINUTES:
  - Motion to approve was made by Vicki Ford, seconded by Lisa Lerandeau, and approved unanimously by the members present. There was no discussion.
- INTRODUCTION OF VISITORS: Scott McClellan introduced the following visitors present:
- Dave & Kathy Fechter shared that they are originally from Washington and moved from Florida to be nearer their children. Dave said he has owned five corvettes and currently drives a 2007 magnetic red vette with 12,000 miles. Dave and Kathy are hoping to become members.
- Doug Alspauch shared he was born and raised in Vista and is a retired electrician. He has a 2002 Corvette for sale.
- Nancy Starling is in the process of becoming a member and went on the last NCV run.
   She rode with Janice Diener and described a bit of a "white knuckle" ride! She is currently shopping for a Corvette.
- Ruth Kurisu and JD Duncan introduced Representatives from the Paralyzed Veterans of America Cal-Diego Chapter and the Semper Fi Fund. Peter Ballantyne, Executive Director, Buddy Wachtstetter, DeMarion Pollard and John Pou graciously accepted the donation check on behalf of Cal-Diego. Sandy Hedron graciously accepted the donation check on behalf of the Semper Fi Fund.
  - Check Presentation:
  - Semper Fi Fund received \$8,500 from NCV and a matching gift of \$8,500 from the Bob and Rene Parsons Foundation for a total of \$17,000.

- The Semper Fi Fund was started by and continues to be led by military spouses who provide support and financial grants to wounded and injured service members.
- Paralyzed Veterans of America, Cal-Diego Chapter received \$8,500 from NCV and a matching gift of \$8,500 from California Health Medical Reserve Corps. Additionally, the Easterday Family Foundation awarded a grant of \$25,000 for a grand total of \$42,000.
- Cal-Diego conducts racing motorsports events for paralyzed veterans and recently sold their Corvette "Christine." Their current race car is a 1950 Studebaker Champion Starlighter with a corvette engine.
- The matching funds added to the \$17,000 NCV raised from the car show brought the overall amount to \$59,000.

#### • MEMBERSHIP REPORT:

• Scott McClellan reported 32 members in attendance. Current total membership was reported at 63 with 2 members pending payment. Scott also reported that John Boyd rejoined and has bought a white 2017 ZO6.

#### • TREASURER'S REPORT:

- Submitted by Dave Tracy. These reports are not available for public view.
- NEW BUSINESS:
- Club Historian: President, Carm Finocchiaro suggested that a position for Club Historian be considered. The purpose would be to document the club's history to share with the membership. The Board of Directors will discuss and prepare recommendations for the membership to consider.
- New Board Position: President, Carm Finocchiaro proposed adding the immediate past president as a position on the BOD. He stated that the past president could provide valuable experience and information to the club. The Board of Directors will discuss and prepare recommendations for the membership to consider.
